en by the high resolution camera on board NASA's Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter in order to showcase minority languages. Our intrepid amateur astronomers, bards and Cornish language speakers Rod Lyon and Steve Harris, got on the case immediately and set to work with NASA translating the English captions to their amazing photographs of Mars into Cornish. This generated a lot of me-

dia interest, resulting in newspaper interviews and radio broadcasts by our two-man team of interplanetary experts. Everyone jumped on the spacewagon for the fun of it, including the Cornish Oafs who found themselves heading up the HiRISE Twitter feed with the picture below right.

Armchair space explorer and ace translator Dr Steve Harris said 'With British astronaut Tim Peake on the International Space Station at the moment, there is a lot of interest in the human exploration of space, so it's a great time for this project to be launched. 
