

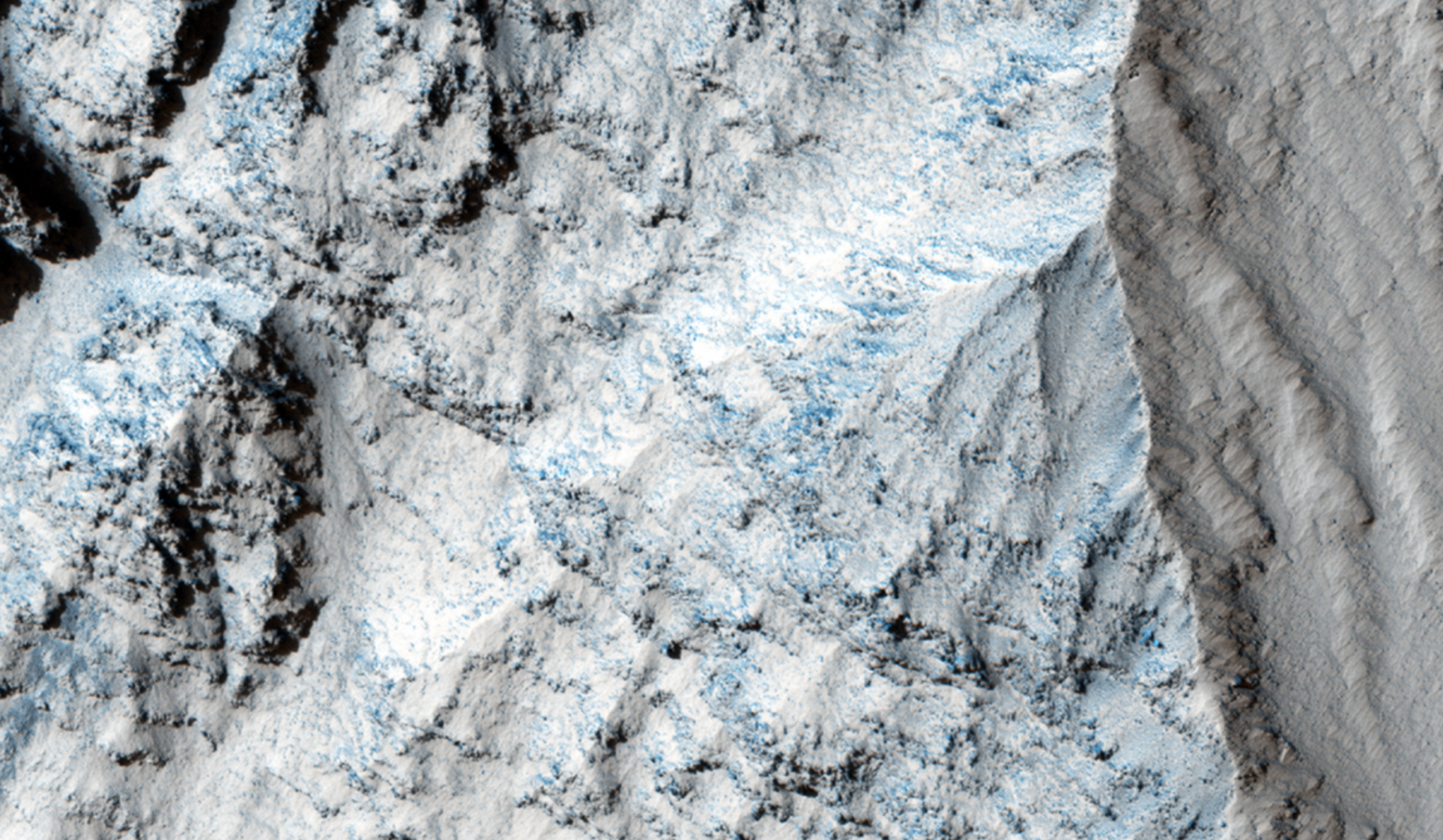

This area was covered in a well known MOC image of October 1997 (AB1-01303) that shows what appears to be layered rock, deep below the Martian surface.
