



New Crater Blues

When we see a combination of two crater shapes on the ground, the one showing a nearly “full circle” will be the younger crater. In this image, we see the combined shape of two impact craters. However, neither crater displays a continuous circular shape (or rim) in the area connecting them. (NASA/JPL/University of Arizona. 307 km above the surface, less than 5 km across.)
