



# Opportunity’s Journey at Endeavour Crater

Opportunity has been on the western rim of 20-kilometer-diameter Endeavour Crater in Meridiani Planum for about two years investigating the 3–4 billion-year-old sedimentary layers of Cape York. Now, more than a decade after the Mars Exploration Rover Opportunity’s 2003 launch, this HiRISE image captures the rover traversing south to new science targets and a winter haven at Solander Point. Opportunity’s destination at Solander Point is thought to have abundant clay-bearing rocks as part of well-exposed geological layers that are sure to provide vital clues to Mars’ watery past.
